- 2. Each category must have at least three nominations to qualify for the judging.
- 3. All nominees will be notified by email that they have been nominated for a Health Care Heroes® Award.
- **4.** All finalists will be **a)** notified by email that they have been selected as a finalist, and **b)** will be asked to submit several photos (One portrait and 10 candid photos alone or in a group, preferably pertaining to the nomination.)
